**ORDINANCE** #1504 – ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14) - CALENDAR YEAR 2011

# CALENDAR YEAR 2011 MODEL ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Keansburg in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2011 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$418,631.00 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS** the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Keansburg, in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2011 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Keansburg shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$418,631.00, and that the CY 2011 municipal budget for the Borough of Keansburg be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

## 2011 FUND YEAR STATEWIDE INSURANCE FUND RISK MANAGEMENT CONSULTANT'S AGREEMENT

**THIS AGREEMENT** entered into this 24<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2011, among the Statewide Insurance Fund ("FUND"), a joint insurance fund of the State of New Jersey, Borough of Keansburg ("MEMBER") and Dominick S. Cinelli of Brown & Brown and James P. Conroy of W.A. Conroy & Son("CONSULTANT") through a fair and open process, pursuant to N.J.S.A.19:44A-20.4.

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT has offered to the MEMBER professional risk management consulting services as required by the Bylaws of the FUND; and

**WHEREAS**, the CONSULTANT has advised the FUND that he/she is familiar with the terms, conditions and operations of the FUND; and

WHEREAS, the MEMBER desires these professional services from the CONSULTANT; and

**WHEREAS**, the MEMBER has complied with relevant law in regard to the appointment of a Risk Management Consultant; and

**WHEREAS**, the Bylaws of the FUND require that members engage a CONSULTANT and that the CONSULTANT comply with certain requirements set forth therein.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** the parties in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, agree as follows:

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- 1. For and in consideration of the amount stated hereinafter, the **CONSULTANT** shall:
  - (a) assist in evaluating the MEMBER'S exposures and advise on matters relating to the Member's operation and coverage.
  - (b) explain to the MEMBER, or its representatives, the various coverages available from the FUND.
  - (c) explain to the MEMBER, or its representatives, the terms of the member's commitment and obligations to the FUND.
  - (d) explain to the MEMBER, or its representatives the operation of the FUND.
  - (e) prepare applications, statements of values, etc., on behalf of the MEMBER, if required by the FUND.
  - (f) review the MEMBER'S assessment and assist in the preparation of the MEMBER'S insurance budget.
  - (g) review losses and engineering reports and provide assistance to the MEMBER'S safety committee, if required.
  - (h) assist in the claims settlement process, if required, by MEMBER or FUND.
  - (i) attend the majority of meetings of the Fund Commissioners or Executive Committee, if requested, and perform such other services as required by the MEMBER or the FUND.
  - (j) comply with the obligations imposed upon Risk Managers in the FUND's Bylaws.
  - (k) act in good faith and fair dealing to the FUND.
  - (I) perform other duties for the FUND as may be required from time to time by the FUND.
- 2. In exchange for the above services, the CONSULTANT shall be compensated in the following manner:
  - (a) The CONSULTANT shall be paid by the FUND, on behalf of the MEMBER, a fee as compensation for services rendered. Said fee, an apportionment of the MEMBER's assessment: 6% of workers' compensation (excluding any fees, PLIGA, and loss ratio apportionment); 7.5% of all lines assessment (excluding any fees, PLIGA, and loss ratio apportionment); and 10% of Selective umbrella assessment (excluding fees, PLIGA and administrative expenses).
  - (b) The CONSULTANT shall be entitled to compensation for services provided during any calendar year only if the CONSULTANT has been appointed and holds the position of Risk Management Consultant, as of January 31 of the said calendar year for counties and municipalities holding general elections and July 30 for municipalities holding regular elections.
  - (c) For any insurance coverages authorized by the MEMBER to be placed outside the FUND, the CONSULTANT shall receive as compensation the normal brokerage commissions paid by the insurance company. The premiums for said policies shall not be added to the FUND's assessment in computing the fee set forth in 2(a).

(d) If the MEMBER shall require of the CONSULTANT extra services other than those outlined above, the CONSULTANT shall be paid by the MEMBER a fee at a rate to be negotiated by the parties.

The term of this Agreement shall be from **January 1, 2011 to January 1, 2012.** However, this Agreement may be terminated by either party at any time by mailing to the other thirty (30) days written notice, certified mail return receipt.

- 4. The CONSULTANT shall comply with all laws applicable to producers who provide insurance products to public entities and shall comply with all applicable statutes and regulations relating to joint insurance funds.
- 5. The CONSULTANT agrees to comply with all affirmative action laws applicable in accordance with Exhibit A and to submit all necessary documentation establishing compliance within seven (7) days of this Agreement.

#### PAR Realty/Ritesh Shah

#### 304 Main Street

John Wiley, Esq. appeared before the council on behelf of his client, PAR Realty. He is proposing demolition of the structure located at 304 Main Street (formerly the "Sports Barn") and construction of a new building consisting of commercial uses on the ground floor and apartments on the second and third floor. They are in contract to buy the liquor to buy the liquor license held by the former owner of the property. PAR Realty has purchased the lot behind the building on Port Monmouth Road to allow for additional parking. One of the commercial used would be for a store selling beer and wine but must contain a bar with seven (7) stools.

The Council, acting as the Redevelopment Agency, expressed that they are not receptive to a third floor on the structure. There was discussion on parking and ingress/egress. The agency members did not feel that the submitted plans showing the front of the building was conducive to the Main Street business area. They would like to see windows and/or entrances on the Main Street side. Also there was concern on the appearance of the building on the Port Monmouth Road side.

Mr. Ritesh Shah also appeared before Council on behalf of PAR Realty. He will confer with his architect to revise the plans. Mr. Wiley will be in contact with the Clerk's office to schedule a future appearance before the Redevelopment Agency.

Raritan Avenue Drainage

At this time Borough Engineer, Francis Mullan, discussed with the Council a drainage improvement to Raritan Avenue. The Raritan Avenue Outfall Drains into town down Carr Avenue to Manning Place. It is the largest amount of area in town utilizing any of the outfalls. Improvements to be considered would begin at Beachway and continue to slightly past East Shore Street. The cost of the project is estimated to be \$500,000.00 and engineering costs of \$90,000.00. Council expressed concern over costs and that Raritan Avenue (Center Avenue to Bayview Avenue) had been repaved approximately five years ago. Mr. Mullan assured Council that the lines would be videotaped prior to any reconstruction. A water main on Raritan Avenue would also be replaced during construction.
