Ordinance #1705 – 2023 Bond Ordinance for Roadway Improvements

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR WATER MAIN REPLACEMENTS, DRAINAGE SYSTEM UPGRADES, AND ROAD RECONSTRUCTION, AND APPROPRIATING \$2,897,500 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,293,100 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF KEANSBURG, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF KEANSBURG, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general and water/sewer improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Keansburg, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,897,500, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including \$87,500 from the Recreation Omni Lease Trust, \$200,000 from the Borough's Water/Sewer Operating Budget, grant funds in the amount of \$191,900 expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), and the sum of \$125,000 as down payment for said purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$2,293,100, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of water main replacements, drainage system upgrades, and the reconstruction of various roads throughout the Borough, including, but not limited to, Forest Avenue, Evergreen Place, Willis Avenue, Park Avenue, Collins Street, Beachway Avenue, Lincoln Court, Wilson Avenue, Frances Place, Locust Street, Lincoln Court, Holly Street, Garden Street, Wood Avenue and Railroad Avenue, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with contracts, plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.



- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$2,293,100, as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$2,897,500, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The excess of the appropriation of \$2,897,500 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the \$87,500 from the Recreation Omni Lease Trust for the improvements to Wood Avenue, \$200,000 from the Borough's Water/Sewer Operating Budget for the water main replacements, grant funds in the amount of \$191,900 expected to be received from the NJDOT for the reconstruction of Beachway Avenue, and the sum of \$125,000 as down payment for said purposes.
- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.
- Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general and water/sewer improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is twenty (20) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$2,293,100 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.



- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$400,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.
- (e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto.
- Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.
- Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.
- Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Ordinance #1706 – Index Rate Ordinance CY2023

CALENDAR YEAR 2023 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to

3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Keansburg, in the County of Monmouth, finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2023 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council hereby determines that a 1% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$161,342.83 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Mayor and Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Keansburg, in the County of

Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY

2023 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Keansburg shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$564,699.91, and that the CY 2023 municipal budget for the Borough of Keansburg be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,



BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Authorization Resolution – MCIA 2023 Pooled Notes

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF \$2,573,836 BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF KEANSBURG, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY TO THE MONMOUTH COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY, AND DETERMINING VARIOUS MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, the Borough of Keansburg, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough") has heretofore adopted, from time to time, various bond ordinances (the "Bond Ordinances") authorizing various capital improvements, and the issuance and sale, from time to time, of its bonds and bond anticipation notes in order to finance such capital improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Bond Ordinances authorize the Chief Financial Officer to sell any bond anticipation notes thereunder at public or private sale, as determined by the Chief Financial Officer; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has applied to The Monmouth County Improvement Authority (the "MCIA") to participate in its pooled governmental note financing program (the "Program"); and

WHEREAS, under the Program, the MCIA will issue and sell its pooled notes (the "MCIA Notes"), which MCIA Notes will be secured by (i) payments by various governmental entities located in Monmouth County (including the Borough) under various notes issued by such entities to the MCIA and (ii) the unconditional guaranty of the County of Monmouth (the "County"); and

WHEREAS, on March 8, 2023, the New Jersey Local Finance Board held a hearing and issued positive findings in respect of the issuance of the MCIA Notes by the MCIA; and

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to participate in the Program, and to issue and sell all or a portion of its bond anticipation notes to the MCIA; and

WHEREAS, the Borough will receive a proposal for the purchase of such bond anticipation notes from the MCIA, which purchase will be effected through a note purchase agreement to be entered into between the Borough and the MCIA; and

WHEREAS, the Borough acknowledges that the MCIA intends to execute a contract of purchase with an underwriter pertaining to the sale of the MCIA Notes, the proceeds of which shall be used by the MCIA, inter alia, to purchase the such bond anticipation notes of the Borough; and

The execution and delivery by the Mayor, the Business Administrator or the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough (each, an "Authorized Officer") of the Note Purchase Agreement, in such form as shall be approved by such officer, is hereby authorized, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by such officer's execution thereof.
- SECTION 3. The Borough hereby authorizes the use of certain information concerning the Program Notes and the Borough in the Preliminary Official Statement and final Official Statement of the MCIA, to be used in connection with the marketing and sale of the MCIA Notes.
- SECTION 4. The execution and delivery by an Authorized Officer of a Continuing Disclosure Agreement, if any, to be dated as of the date of closing of the MCIA Notes, between the Borough and the trustee for the MCIA Notes, in such form as shall be approved by such officer, is hereby authorized, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by such officer's execution thereof.
- SECTION 5. A portion of the proceeds of sale of the Program Notes to the MCIA may be retained by the MCIA as payment for the Borough's allocable share of issuance expenses and expenses related to the County Guaranty. Any Authorized Officer is hereby authorized and directed to pay all of the costs associated with the sale and issuance of the Program Notes.
- SECTION 6. The Authorized Officers and any other officer of the Borough, and the staff and consultants of the Borough, are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions and execute any other agreement which may be necessary or convenient to effectuate the terms of this resolution in connection with the issuance, sale and delivery of the Program Notes, which includes the review and delivery of a preliminary official statement and official statement on behalf of the Borough, and the execution of the Note Purchase Agreement, the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, if any, and any other agreement to be executed in connection with the issuance of the Program Notes or the MCIA Notes.
 - SECTION 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Designate Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area – Grandview Apts

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF KEANSBURG DECLARING THE PROPERTIES IDENTIFIED AS BLOCK 15, LOT 2 AND BLOCK 53, LOT 1 (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE STUDY AREA") TO BE AN AREA IN NEED OF NON-CONDEMNATION REDEVELOPMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq. ("Redevelopment Law"), authorizes municipalities to determine whether certain parcels of land located therein constitute areas in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, on September 21, 2022, the Borough Council ("Council") of the Borough of Keansburg ("Borough") adopted Resolution 22-100, authorizing and directing the Planning Board of the Borough ("Board") to undertake a preliminary investigation and redevelopment study to determine whether the properties identified as Block 15, Lot 2 and Block 53, Lot 1, thereof ("Study Area"), meet the criteria set forth in the Redevelopment Law and should be designated as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area, as that term is defined by the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, the Board conducted a preliminary investigation of the Study Area to determine whether it should be designated as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area in accordance with the criteria and procedures set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 and 40A:12A-6; and

WHEREAS, as part of its preliminary investigation, the Board caused Caroline Reiter, P.P., AICP, from T&M Associates, the Board's Consulting Planner, to prepare a Redevelopment Study & Preliminary Investigation Report ("Redevelopment Study") for the Board for its consideration in determining whether the Study Area should be designated a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Study found that Block 15, Lot 2 and Block 53, Lot 1 qualified as an Area in Need of Redevelopment under both N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5(a) and (d), and that the Study Area should be designated a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the foregoing, Ms. Reiter prepared a map showing the boundaries of the proposed redevelopment area and locations of the parcels or properties included therein, along with a statement setting forth the basis for its investigation in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6(b) (1); and

WHEREAS, public hearings were conducted by the Board on February 6, 2023 and March 13, 2023, with notice having been properly given pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6(b) (3); and

WHEREAS, at the public hearings, the Board reviewed the Study Area, the map and associated documents, and heard testimony from Ms. Reiter and others; and



WHEREAS, at the public hearings, members of the general public were given an opportunity to be heard and to address questions to the Board concerning the potential designation of the Study Area as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, after completing its investigation and public hearings on this matter, the Board concluded that there was sufficient credible evidence to support findings that satisfy the criteria set forth in the Redevelopment Law, particularly at N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5(a) and (d) for designating the Study Area as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area and that said designation is necessary for the effective redevelopment of the area comprising the Study Area; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Redevelopment Law and as memorialized by resolution on March 13, 2023 (attached as Exhibit A), the Board recommended to the Borough Council that the properties identified as Block 15, Lot 2 and Block 53, Lot 1 be designated as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council considered the Board's recommendation at its scheduled public meeting on March 15, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council accepted the recommendation of the Planning Board to declare the Study Area as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Keansburg, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey accepts the recommendation from the Planning Board of the Borough of Keansburg and finds that the properties identified as Block 15, Lot 2 and Block 53, Lot 1 as shown on the official tax map of the Borough of Keansburg be and are hereby deemed to be a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area pursuant to the Local al Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5(a) and (d); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the designation of the properties identified as Block 15, Lot 2 and Block 53, Lot 1 as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area shall **not** authorize the Borough, acting as the duly authorized redevelopment entity, to exercise the power of eminent domain to acquire any property in the Study Area; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Borough hereby reserves all other authority and powers granted to it under the Redevelopment Law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Borough of Keansburg shall forthwith transmit a copy of the within Resolution to the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs for review; and



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that within ten (10) days of the Borough Council's adoption of the within Resolution, the Clerk of the Borough of Keansburg shall serve notice of the Borough Council's determination and a copy of this Resolution upon all record owners of property within the Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area, those whose names are listed on the tax assessor's records, and upon each person who filed a written objection thereto and stated, in or upon such written submission, an address to which notice of the determination and Resolution may be sent; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such notice shall be in a form consistent with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5(e) (i) and (ii); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
